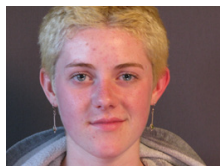

The individual journeys into dyslexia are told by students ranging from second grade to college levels as well as entrepreneur Steve Walker of New England Pellet, inventor Ben Foss of Intel, author Jonathan Mooney, consumer advocate Erin Brockovitch, and Nobel Laureate Dr. Carol Greider. Each share their frustrations with being misunderstood by teachers and friends and the emotional impact this learning disability had on their lives.

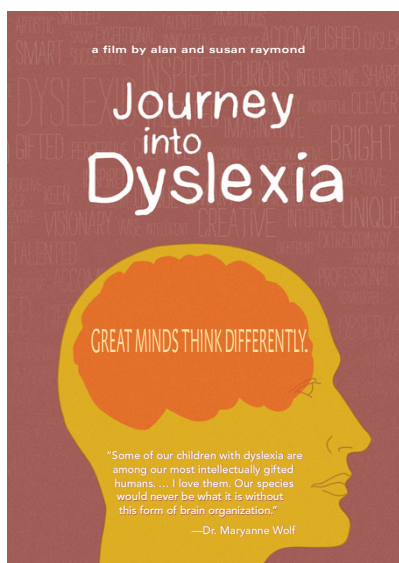
